Dear Parents

As you all know we have now gone through our ISI inspection and are awaiting the report. I would like to thank all of the parents and children for their support in filling in the questionnaires. The children and the staff made a very strong and positive impression on the Inspectors. As you will understand I am not in a position to make further comment at this time.

Year 6 continue to work incredibly hard toward their next school placements. My congratulations to them on the quality of their work and indeed the superb way in which they are leading the school as our senior pupils. Well done Year 6 on an excellent term's work.

Year 6 enjoyed a Junior Citizenship afternoon at Lingfield Race Course. I am pleased to report that the Year 5 Bushcraft trip was enjoyed by everyone. The children had a fantastic time and my thanks to Mr Burke and Mrs Gorman for making it possible. Year 5 also enjoyed a Music Expressive Arts concert at the Fairfield Halls. Year 4 children were able to go on the annual Bough Beech reservoir trip and they too learned a lot and had a good time. Thank you Mrs Leyshon for arranging it. Mrs Dowling and Mrs Rocha took a very excited LKG class into Caterham Valley on an experience morning. I do believe that they visited Waitrose as well.

Our annual visit to St Mary's Church for our Harvest Festival Service was marked by a wonderful collection of food supplies that were ultimately donated to the Caterham Food Bank. Thank you all for your kindness and generosity. Mrs Carter, one of the PFOG team, was instrumental in enabling this all to happen. I instigated a round of applause with Reverand Frany's permission for the beautiful singing that our children delivered for us. There was a lovely atmosphere in the church, full of joy and celebration. It was a pleasure to be able to invite parents in to watch assemblies that were delivered by Years 2, 3 and 4 respectively. Three of our swimmers represented the London South region at the Olympic Pool in London. Scarlett K, won 2 individual gold medals and Alec W one individual gold medal, one individual silver medal and one silver team medal. Sienna O performed wonderfully on her leg of the team relay but unfortunately they came just outside of the medals. Both Alec and Sienna were facing the huge challenge of swimming in a 50m pool. Scarlett on the other hand came away from the Olympic Pool for the third year running retaining her gold for her breaststroke. There were also two swimming gals at Caterham and Royal Russell and children from Years 3 to 6 performed really well. Congratulations also to Mrs Evans, our lead Swimming Coach and Mrs Cox, Assistant Swimming Coach.

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Mr Burke led our anti-bullying week assembly and everyone enjoyed Odd Sock Day. Mrs Dawson arranged for a special assembly for our LAMDA candidates and in excess of 25 children performed in front of their parents and the school. The School Council under the leadership of President Tabitha S and guided by Mr B have been very busy this term. I would like to thank the Vice Presidents Emilie S and Millie T, and Councillors from Year 5 Ania S and Vivienne L, Year 4 George G and Harriet J, Year 3 Rhian P and Georgia R-b, Year 2 Harrison G and Eloise J and Year 1 Honor K and Ava S.
