**Dear Parents** 

Once again, we have had an incredibly busy and successful term.

We ended the sporting side of things this term with a Year 6 Sports Colours Award Assembly and our special guests were Ms Felicity Sewell, Director of Sport, Caterham School and Ms Michelle Pierre-Carr, former British 400 metre athlete and Commonwealth Games Silver Medallist. All of the children received their well-deserved colours awards for their commitment, talent and enthusiasm in a variety of sports. My thanks to Miss Lomax for all that she has done in arranging this event and the whole sporting programme for the term. My thanks also to Caterham School and their sports staff for providing additional coaching of the highest level for our Years 3 and 4 children on a Tuesday afternoon.

Our Years 3 to 6 swimmers had two galas both away at Reigate Grammar School and Royal Russell. Our Year 6 swimmers were busy with the It's a Fish Out life saving competition in Dorking where our A team came 5<sup>th</sup> and our B team 17<sup>th</sup> out of a total of 24 teams. Well done to Connie H, Millie T, Magdalena M, Elissa L, Scarlett K, Katie R, Surina R and Vincent N. A huge congratulations to our ESSA team members Scarlett K, Amaaya P, Daniel H and Jude M who won bronze medals in both medley and freestyle relays. They are hoping to progress by qualification to the Primary Regionals in May 2024. There was the usual high excitement around all of the Inter-House swimming galas and a massive congratulations to everyone who took part in the events for Stanstead and Hillside. Well done to our swimmers in KG and Year 1, Years 2 and 3 and Years 4, 5 and 6, all of whom performed brilliantly in their respective galas. We will announce the overall results at Prize Giving. I am very proud to announce that our school swimming charity scavenger hunt in aid of Children with Cancer UK has already reached a grand donation total of £1,761.00 and rising.
