NOTES FROM MRS MITCHELL

Dear Parents

It has been a full and lively fortnight at school, with so many opportunities for the children to learn, grow, and celebrate together. As I continue to get to know the school, I am struck each day by the energy, curiosity, and kindness your boys and girls bring to our community.

We began with a Phonics and Number Workshop for Pre-Reception and Reception, led by Mrs Dowling and Miss Wright. It was wonderful to see parents exploring the approaches we use in class and finding ways to support learning at home.

A special highlight came with the visit of Mr Gowers from Warlingham Rugby Club, who presented us with a First Team shirt to celebrate our new sponsorship. The shirt will soon be proudly displayed in school, marking the start of what promises to be a strong partnership. In our celebration assembly, we also recognised the many children who took part in the local Tough Mudder and 'Run Reigate.' A special mention goes to Isabelle, Ophelia, and Georgia, who achieved 1st, 2nd, and 4th place respectively in the Year 5 girls' category—an outstanding achievement!

The children have also enjoyed a variety of enrichment opportunities. A drama workshop encouraged imaginative thinking, confident performance, and strong curriculum links. Year 2 and Year 4 enjoyed juice, dominoes, and donuts, while Year 3 had great fun with Jenga and Jammie Dodgers. I particularly valued spending time in the library with Reception and Year 1, sharing stories and discovering which books excite them most. Many children have also been keen to share their 'Personal Best' (PB) moments with me—named, of course, after Paddington Bear. The Year 4 Assembly was a delight, with the children confidently explaining the water cycle and seasonal changes. My thanks goes to Miss Hopkins for her support and guidance in preparing the children so well.

On Monday we presented our new Eco Leaders with their badges. In assembly, I spoke about the importance of respect—not only for one another, but also for the environment we share. The Eco Leaders will work with Miss Wright, our Charities Lead, to adopt a rhino in recognition of World Rhino Day. The children showed great interest as they learned about endangered species and what we can do to protect them. Congratulations to Pareesa K (Y5), Isla (Y4), Willow (Y3), Gracie (Y2), and Hendrix (Y1). Thank you also to our Health and Safety Governor, Jane Bond,

who kindly collected acorns from her oak tree for the children to pot up in Forest School. We look forward to seeing which of them grow into saplings!

We also held our first School Council meeting, led confidently by our President, Jaimin, and Vice Presidents Leela and Lizzie. Eliza in Year 6 shared some particularly insightful ideas as the Fourth Member, while Charlie did a sterling job as Secretary. The boys and girls brought along their ideas boxes and showed real teamwork and collaboration as they worked together to share suggestions for the term ahead.

Reception

This week in Reception we've been busy starting our brand-new topic: *People Who Help Us*. The children have loved exploring the important role of firefighters — in Literacy we've been labelling different parts of a fire engine, and in Expressive Arts and Design we even had a go at designing and creating our very own fire engines!

In Maths, we've been continuing to build our number skills. We've been consolidating recognising and ordering numbers, paying close attention to forming each digit accurately and neatly. To help with our number ordering, we've been using Miss Wright's very mixed-up number line and pegs — the children have enjoyed solving the puzzle of putting everything back in the correct place.

Our Phonics sessions have been full of energy and fun! We've been focusing on the sounds 'qu' and 'ch', and have also learned a brilliant new rhyme to help us remember our digraphs. The children are really growing in confidence when spotting and sounding out digraphs in their reading.

We also had the chance to take part in an amazing Perform Workshop, where the children became heroes on an imaginative adventure. They threw themselves into the activities with so much enthusiasm, showing off their confidence, teamwork and creativity.

In Music, the children have been practising for our Harvest Celebration. We've started learning our "Cabbages Green" song — it's sounding fantastic already (and it's safe to say it's stuck in all of our heads too!). We can't wait to share it with you soon.

Year 1

Year 1 have been fully engaged in Marvellous Maths, exploring shapes, numbers, and problem-solving. In Excellent English they have been building their writing and reading skills with growing confidence, while Scintillating Science has sparked plenty of curiosity and wonder about the world around them. Their digital learning adventures have also taken off, as the children were introduced to the world of coding and algorithms using Beebots. They learned how to sequence instructions and solve problems creatively, all while having great fun navigating their Beebots through exciting challenges.

A further highlight was the Perform Drama Workshop, where the children joined forces with Mildred the Witch on a thrilling mission to reclaim a powerful sword from King Arthur. Our budding actors stepped into the story with energy and imagination, showing fantastic teamwork and storytelling skills. The week was rounded off with a special Story Time session with Mrs Mitchell, where the children gathered to enjoy a carefully chosen story together.

Year 2

In our History lessons, we have been enjoying finding out about old toys and how they are similar and also different to the ones we enjoy today. We met Old Bear who will be 99 this November and looked at an Edwardian doll's tea set which was beautiful but very "delicate". Great work Year 2! We have been learning new vocabulary to help us with our historical investigation such as century, antique, Victorian and Edwardian.

We have also been very busy working on our assembly which is linked to our very exciting Science topic "Animals including humans". We have been working extremely hard rehearsing and can't wait to show you next week!

Year 3

On Thursdays, Year 3 stretch our minds with critical thinking activities. Last week, the children tackled a fun and thoughtful challenge with a feelings sudoku. Instead of numbers, they used images representing different emotions. The aim was to place each image so that every row, column and mini-grid contained one of each feeling without any repeats. It was a fantastic way to build logical thinking whilst also exploring emotional awareness.



In English, we've been learning about free verse poetry - a style of poetry that doesn't need to rhyme or follow a set structure. The children were inspired by author Michael Rosen to perform poetry in front of the class. Different tones of voice, facial expressions, actions, and changing the speed and volume of their reading made the children's poetry performances lively and engaging. It was a pleasure to see their confidence grow as they brought poems to life!

Year 5

This term within Year 5's History work we are learning about life during the Tudor Times. We have already researched what Tudor life would be like within their villages and towns and this week we looked at the type of clothing Tudor monarchs would have worn. We then put our best creative and artistic skills to the test and became Fashion Designers for the day! We created our own outfits for a Tudor King or Queen using the knowledge we had developed throughout our lesson. The children were fantastic designers and thought carefully about all the finer elements of each individual piece of clothing. Next week, we are going to be designing a Tudor home and look forward to sharing these with you.



Year 6

In Maths, we have been exploring large numbers up to the millions, as well as ordering and multiplying decimals. A real challenge came when we faced a question on an 11+ paper involving circles. This led us into new learning about the area and circumference of circles and discovering Pi, which the children have enjoyed tackling with enthusiasm.

In English, our work on *Kensuke's Kingdom* has inspired some excellent writing, including diary entries and storm descriptions. The children have also shown great perseverance with their loop card words, beating their personal bests several times. In science, we have been learning about inheritance and evolution, thinking carefully about the traits we inherit from our parents and how living things change over time. In history, our focus has been on the long- and short-term causes of the First World War, while in geography we have begun our volcanoes topic, looking at the structure of the Earth and how volcanoes are formed. It has been a busy but rewarding fortnight, and the children should be very proud of their hard work.

Art Curriculum


Year 6 have made an impressive start to their 'Landscapes' project. They have been considering atmospheric and linear perspective to give their work a sense of depth.




