Reception

This week, we joined the rest of the school in observing the Remembrance 2-minute silence and listening to the Last Post. The children showed great respect and understanding as we talked about why this moment is so important.

Our topic for the past two weeks has been Roald Dahl, and what fun we've had exploring the magical worlds created by this much-loved author! We've enjoyed reading some of his most famous stories and have been inspired to do some wonderful creative work of our own. The children designed their very own golden ticket invitations, invented and illustrated new sweets, and even concocted their own marvellous medicine recipes! To finish off our Roald Dahl adventures, we built the very first Oakhyrst Grange Chocolate Factory – what an incredible team effort!

Year 1

We're delighted to share that rehearsals for our Nativity performance are well underway and going swimmingly. The children are already showing great confidence with their lines, actions, and songs—it's shaping up to be a wonderful show!

In Maths this week, we explored measuring length using different tools and units. The children also worked hard on practising the 2 and 5 times tables, showing brilliant progress and growing confidence. In English, we wrapped up our work on the alphabet and learned how to order words alphabetically. The class enjoyed hands-on activities that helped them recognise the importance of alphabetical order in everyday life.

Our budding scientists took their learning outdoors as they identified different trees by their leaves. They examined shape, colour, and texture to compare and classify a variety of leaves—great observational skills all around! This week in Digital Learning, we began exploring key vocabulary linked to algorithms. The children are learning what an algorithm is and why clear instructions are important—a fantastic foundation for future computing tasks.

Year 2

This week, Year 2 focused on one of their favourite activities—learning in the woods! When asked, they summed up their experience using the following adjectives and phrases:

- colossal (our absolute favourite new word!)
- intriguing

- incredible
- fun, fun fun!

Year 3

Year 3 had an amazing day stepping back in time with a Stone Age to Iron Age workshop. The children were fascinated to learn about how Britain looked during the Ice Age and how early humans survived by hunting woolly mammoths. They even played lively games to understand what life was like for Neanderthals!

After break, the class explored real and replica artefacts, answered quiz questions and enjoyed a Bronze Age board game. In the afternoon, they discovered how farming began, why stone was used for building, and how bronze and iron changed life forever.

Year 4

In English, the children have been busy writing their very own play scripts, using all their creativity and imagination to bring their stories to life. Next week, they will be performing their plays to the rest of the class – we can't wait to see their amazing writing and acting skills in action! In Maths, Year 4 have been learning how to accurately draw bar charts, and they've done a brilliant job! They collected data from the class, created a tally chart of data and plotted this onto a bar chart to show Year 4's favourite colours. Everyone worked carefully to make sure their charts were clear, colourful, and accurate.

We also enjoyed celebrating Odd Socks Day this week, showing off our individuality and kindness in style. There were plenty of bright, colourful, and funky socks on display – and even a few Christmas ones sneaking out early.

Our classroom is also looking extra special thanks to our new Anglo-Saxon brooch display. The children worked so hard on these beautiful creations, and they have become a real talking point in Year 4 – everyone loves admiring the wonderful designs!



Year 5

The children have been focusing on their descriptive writing skills within our English lessons, exploring a variety of stylistic effects including similes, metaphors and personification to enhance our work. We have written descriptions of firework night, the school woods, a jungle and over the weekend, I am sure many of us will be visiting our local supermarket to help write our descriptive pieces of homework! It has been a joy to see their confidence grow as the week has progressed and how they have experimented with language to create vivid and engaging descriptions.

In Science, we have reached the end of our *Earth and Space* topic. This week, the children particularly enjoyed learning about the dwarf planets, asking thoughtful questions and showing brilliant enthusiasm for the wonders of our solar system. Our Geography lessons have continued to explore the features of coastlines and the powerful effects of erosion. The class have shown excellent curiosity as they build their understanding of how natural forces shape the world around us. Within History, we continue to research into the historical period of the Tudors.

Year 6

In English, the children have continued developing their use of expanded noun phrases and have been practising how to infer a character's emotions. They have also been writing about a place they know well, taking time to look at it in greater detail and describe it vividly. I am really looking forward to reading their finished pieces! The children particularly enjoyed hearing about my favourite place and seeing a photo of me as a child, in my nan and grandad's garden. It definitely helped inspire their own ideas.

In Maths, we have been learning how to divide fractions using the reciprocal, following our memorable acronym KFC (Keep, Flip, Change). Not the chicken kind! The children have grasped this concept brilliantly and applied it with confidence.

In History, we have completed our comic strips on Franz Ferdinand, showing great creativity and understanding of key historical events. Meanwhile, in Science, we wrapped up our investigation on peppered moths, exploring how they adapted to changes in their environment. We discovered that the white peppered moths became almost extinct during the time when factories were heavily used, as soot from pollution clung to the trees and turned the bark black, making it much easier for predators to spot the lighter moths.

The children also thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the Remembrance assembly, especially singing "It's a Long Way to Tipperary" with great enthusiasm and respect. It was a wonderful way to reflect and honour those who served.

Sport

Epsom College Cross country competition - Friday 17th October 2025

Before half term, some of our Year 5 & 6 runners competed in an exciting cross-country event at Epsom College. The challenging 2.5km course saw hundreds of competitors in each race and an incredible atmosphere throughout.
